Course Description: This is a comprehensive high school math course covering most of the New York State curriculum in Geometry. At the end of our course you will have a final exam but not be required to take the Regents Geometry exam. The pace of the class is designed to give students a chance to understand and work with each concept during class. There will be assignments designed for extra practice. At the start of each unit a copy of the topics, quiz dates, and test date will be handed out. It is expected that you will use this information to be prepared to ask questions during class, and know when you are being assessed.

Supplies

- Textbook: Amsco's Geometry – you need to cover the textbook
- Notebook or Binder –with folders
- TI-84 graphing calculator is recommended, but a scientific calculator is required
- Graph paper
- Pens and pencils

Attendance: Absent students are responsible for all work covered during their absence. Students will have 1 day per excused absence to make up material. Unexcused absences will not warrant extra time for homework assignments. If you are in school but have an early leave, or you arrive late and miss class, the homework assignment is still due that day.

Notebook: Taking notes is a necessary skill in developing understanding of the material and keeping track of important information. I will check your notebook on a daily basis to help you with your organization. When absent you are expected to come in and get the notes, print them off the internet, or copy them from a classmate.

Assignments: Label all assignments with your name, date, page numbers and problem set. I will assign the amount of work that I feel is necessary to practice the skills we have learned in class. I intend that **all** of the assignments be completed. There will be frequent assignment quizzes to check for understanding of the material.

Corrections and improving your grade – After each exam, quiz or hw quiz is returned, students should examine their work to learn from their mistakes. I will provide the students with the opportunity to correct these assessments to improve their grade. The corrections must not only

show the correct answer but explain what the student did wrong the first time. HW-quiz corrections are worth 50% of the missed points, quiz corrections are worth 40% of the missed points, test corrections are worth 30% of the missed points, and are added back to the original test grade. There will not be retests or other extra credit assignments.
