The community also elected to change our Board member nomination process from specific seat to at large. This new format will begin with Board elections in May 2018.

She is a true lifetime Yellow Jacket and her welcoming smile and historical knowledge will be missed. We wish both a happy retirement and thank them for their years of professional service to the students of Madrid-Waddington.

This summer will see another round of construction as the Phase II scope of work from the capital project is completed. The work will consist of upgrades to our heating management system, renovations of four student restrooms in the high school, conversion of an unused computer lab to a classroom, addition of two public restrooms in the district hallway, and replacement of the high school cafeteria floor. In addition to Phase II we will also be replacing several sets of windows in the middle school hallway as part of the capital outlay project.

Congratulations to all recent National Junior Honor Society and National Honor Society inductees. Hard work, devotion, and participation are key components of success and it is nice to see such a large number of students recognized with this honor.

A fond farewell to the graduating class of 2017. The Madrid-Waddington school community has prepared you well to be productive and honorable. 


Summa Cum Laude



IMPORTANT REGENTS EXAM UPDATE from GUIDANCE OFFICE

REGENTS EXAM REQUIREMENTS

All regular education students must get at least a <u>65 on FIVE Regents exams</u> and meet course and credit requirements to graduate in New York State with a REGENTS diploma. Students planning to obtain an ADVANCED REGENTS diploma have additional test requirements. The exams required for a REGENTS diploma are:

Common Core/Integrated Algebra
One Science Regents
US History & Government

Global History and Geography Comprehensive English

Students who are interested in re-taking a Regents exam, either for a higher score, or to meet the 65 requirement can take exams in the summer. Please check with the Guidance Office for registration information, cost, and testing dates.

THERE IS A FEE TO TAKE A REGENTS EXAM DURING THE SUMMER

Also, any student interested in attending SUMMER SCHOOL must contact the Guidance Office by June 28 for enrollment information. The Guidance Office will be open June 26, 27, and 28, 2017 - 8:00 AM to 2:30 PM

Information for College-Bound Juniors

Juniors completed a resume and a career inventory earlier in the year to prepare them to attend "Gateways to Careers" at SUNY CANTON in April. We encourage juniors who are interested in college to spend time this summer thinking about colleges they feel might be a good fit. Visiting colleges you have a strong interest in is also a valuable experience to determine whether you feel those colleges will meet your needs. College websites are wonderful resources for finding out about campus tours, open houses, admission requirements, financial aid and other pertinent data.

In the Fall of 2017, students who plan to attend college should take at least one of the college entrance exams (the SAT and/or the ACT). This is especially important for students who intend to go to a four-year college directly out of high school, and who did not take one of these exams Spring of 2017.

IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS....

Students entering school in September 2017—Immunization requirements New York State Law Section 2164 requires certain immunizations

(shots) to attend school. Please see the School Nurse's webpage under immunization tab for complete listing of immunization requirements. NEW requirements for a student entering are as follows:

Kindergarten, First and Second grades —Two (2) doses MMR and two (2) doses Varicella Grades 6, 7 and 8 —Two (2) doses Varicella

Grade 7—One dose Meningococcal

Grade 12– Two (2) doses of Meningococcal or one dose if first dose was received at 16 years of age or older

These vaccinations can be obtained at any Public Health clinic or from your private health care provider.

New York State law requires that all new entrants (whether PreK or Kdg), Grades 2, 4, 7 and 10, and all students entering a school district for the first time have a health examination by a New York State licensed provider. This exam must be provided to school within 30 days of entry into school or the grade levels indicated. A review of the immunization certificates and/or other proof of immunity are needed at the time of registration of all students, inclusive of new entrants and transfers.

Medication: If your child will be taking medicine at school, provider and parent permission forms are needed for both prescription and over-the-counter medications. New medication permission forms are required each year and the form is available online under the "Medications" tab of the School Nurse webpage.


