Drone Soccer at Madrid-Waddington

This year, students in grades 8-12 were offered the opportunity to enroll in a class called drone soccer. This was a new endeavor for the district and has proven quite successful in its first year. This year's team won the US Drone Soccer regional championship, which included all of New York State. At Nationals, the team placed sixth in the nation.



Drone soccer is a course where students learn how to build, program, fly, and repair drones that are encased in a plastic cage. The



drones are built from scratch, with approximately 250 pieces. Students program the drones with a program called Betaflight. Each time a student's drone breaks, they are responsible for fixing it.


The game of drone soccer is much like Quidditch. There are five drones per team. The striker is the only position that scores. The other four drones guard the goal and help the striker score. The goals in drone soccer are rings suspended from the top of the netted arena, which is 10' wide by 20' long by 12' high. Each match consists of 3 sets that are 3 minutes long. The team who wins two sets wins the match. Between sets there is time to change batteries and repair drones that may have been damaged in flight.


This year, our students had the opportunity to present drone soccer to over 250 people at the *North Country Collaborative* conference at SUNY Potsdam in November, worked

with students from Peru and Salmon River Cen-



tral School in March, met with the St. Lawrence Sheriff's Department, competed at Regional and National US Drone Soccer competitions at SUNY Polytechnic Institute, and held a community event with





Drone programs will continue to grow next year at M-W. Courses offered will include:

- Introduction to drones and drone programming (grades 6-8), quarter-long course, daily
- Drone Soccer (grades 8-12), full year, every other day
- FAA Drone Pilot Certification Preparation (Ages 16+), Beginning Q4, Spring, 2024 Students who are interested in these classes should contact their guidance counselors, who will add it to their schedules.

June 2023 Regents Exams:

Special Appeals

Any student who meets the following eligibility conditions may appeal to earn a diploma with a lower score on a Regents Examination. These conditions are specific to the special appeal.

- The student must have taken the Regents Examination during the June 2022, August 2022, January 2023, June 2023, or August 2023 test administration periods.
- The student must have a score of 50-64 on the Regents Examination that is the subject of the appeal and was taken during one
 of the above administrations.
- The student must have a course average in the subject under appeal (as evidenced in the official transcript that records grades achieved by the student in each quarter of the school year) that meets or exceeds the required passing grade by the school.
- . If you have any questions regarding this special appeal, please contact your child's school counselor.

Note: This will be a limited rule in effect for exams taken during these specific administration periods only (June/August 2022, January/June/August 2023). Special appeals may be applied towards any diploma type (local, Regents, and Regents with Advanced Designation). Special appeals do not count towards the maximum number of appeals that can be applied to specific diploma types.

IMPORTANT SUMMER SCHOOL INFORMATION

SUMMER SCHOOL INFORMATION FROM THE GUIDANCE OFFICE

There are two options for students to attend summer school this summer. Information and registration needs to be completed through the Guidance Office. Please contact your child's counselor to inquire.

Students will be contacted by their school counselor when grades have been finalized **IF** they need to participate.

Option 1: Attend in person to OFA summer school. Dates of operation are July 10, 2023 - July 26, 2023 for students taking a non Regents course; July 26, 2023 - August 15, 2023 for students taking a Regents course. Students can take a maximum of two classes each session if needed. Summer school hours are 7:30 am - 12:35 pm. Students must arrange their own transportation. Only for students in grades 9 -12.

Option 2: SLL BOCES Regional summer school- online only. Dates of operation are July 10, 2023 - August 15, 2023. This is video- based coursework. Teachers will provide students help with the curriculum. While students are permitted to work at their own pace, each student is required to get on a morning call with their homeroom teacher from 8:00 am - 8:15 am daily. Students are expected to engage in their work at a minimum of Monday- Thursday. Only for students in grades 9 -12.

Registration deadline and additional information will be provided in the coming weeks.

*There is **no summer school for Students in grades 7-8** who failed a class or classes during the school year. Please contact your child's counselor for more information regarding how this will impact your child.





Information for College-Bound Juniors

Juniors completed a resume and a career inventory earlier in the year to prepare them for life after high school. We encourage juniors who are interested in college to spend time this summer thinking about colleges they feel might be a good fit. Visiting colleges you have a strong interest in is also a valuable experience to determine whether you feel those colleges will meet your needs. You may not be able to visit a college in person but a virtual tour can be just as helpful and informative. College websites are wonderful resources for finding out about campus tours, open houses, admission requirements, financial aid and other pertinent data.

In the Fall of 2023, students who plan to attend college should take at least one of the college entrance exams (SAT or ACT). This is especially important for students who intend to go to a four-year college directly out of high school. Be sure to check with the college first to see if they require one of these tests for admission. As some colleges have moved to Test Optional, many require an SAT or ACT for scholarships.

NURSE'S OFFICE Updates...

IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS....

Students entering school in September 2023 - Immunization requirements New York State Law Section 2164 requires that schools will not permit a child to attend school unless the parent provides the school with a certificate of immunization or proof from a physician, nurse practitioner or physician's assistant that the child is in the process of receiving the required immunizations. Public and private school officials may not admit unvaccinated children to school in excess of 14 days. Please see the School Nurse's webpage under immunization tab for complete listing of immunization requirements. NEW requirements for a student entering are as follows:

Kindergarten, 1st, 2nd, 3rd & 4th grades —Two (2) doses MMR and two (2) doses Varicella Grades 6, 7, 8 & 9 —Two (2) doses Varicella

Grades 7, 8 & 9 — One dose Meningococcal

Grade 12– Two (2) doses of Meningococcal or one dose if first dose was received at 16 years of age or older

These vaccinations can be obtained at any Public Health clinic (315-386-2325) or from your private health care provider.

Education Law requires all New York State (NYS) public school students to have a health exam when they are a new student when they enter Pre-K or Kindergarten, and grades 1, 3, 5, 7, 9 and 11. This exam must be provided to school within 30 days of entry into school or the grade levels indicated. A review of the immunization certificates and/or other proof of immunity are needed at the time of registration of all students, inclusive of new entrants and transfers.

Medication: If your child will be taking medicine at school, provider and parent permission forms are needed for both prescription and over-the-counter medications. New medication permission forms are required each year and the form is available online under the "Medications" tab of the School Nurse webpage.


