This will be a busy summer on campus as we are undertaking a lighting project that will see all the lighting fixtures in the building converted to LED. This is a roughly \$500,000 project that is fully funded through the New York Power Authority energy efficiency program. There is no cost to the district and it is estimated that the annual energy savings could be as high as \$20,000.

It has been an absolute pleasure working alongside the class of 2019 on their educational journey and now that it has come to an end, we look forward to their future success. There is no doubt this cohort of excellent young men and women is well prepared to move on to their next adventure and will ensure that Madrid-Waddington is well represented. Best of luck in all future endeavors.

The last day of regularly scheduled classes for 6th grade will be Monday, June 17th. June 18th-20th, 6th grade will be dismissed at 12:00 pm, and on June 21st, 24th, & 25th, dismissal will be at 11:00 a.m.

REGENTS EXAM REQUIREMENTS

All regular education students must get at least a 65 on FIVE Regents exams and meet course and credit requirements to graduate in New York State with a REGENTS diploma. Students planning to obtain an ADVANCED REGENTS diploma have additional test requirements. The exams required for a REGENTS diploma are:

Common Core/Integrated Algebra
One Science Regents
US History & Government

Global History and Geography
Comprehensive English

Students who are interested in re-taking a Regents exam, either for a higher score, or to meet the 65 requirement can take exams in the summer. Please check with the Guidance Office for registration information, and testing dates.

Also, any student interested in attending SUMMER SCHOOL must contact the Guidance Office by June 27 for enrollment information. The Guidance Office will be open **June 26 and 27, 2019 - 8:00 AM to 2:00 PM**

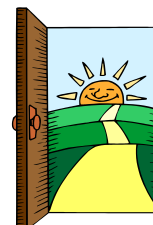
We will continue to send home important information with your children. Please be sure to check book bags each day. If You have any questions, please call our Elementary Office at 315-322-5746, Ext. 201.

Information for College-Bound Juniors

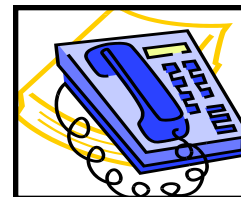

IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS....

Students entering school in September 2019—Immunization requirements New York State Law Section 2164 requires that schools will not permit a child to attend school **unless** the parent provides the school with a certificate of immunization or proof from a physician, nurse practitioner or physician's assistant that the child is in the process of receiving the required immunizations. Public and private school officials may not admit unvaccinated children to school in excess of 14 days. Please see the School Nurse's webpage under immunization tab for complete listing of immunization requirements. NEW requirements for a student entering are as follows:

Kindergarten, 1st, 2nd, 3rd & 4th grades —Two (2) doses MMR and two (2) doses Varicella

Grades 6, 7, 8 & 9 —Two (2) doses Varicella

Grades 7, 8 & 9 —One dose Meningococcal

Grade 12– Two (2) doses of Meningococcal or one dose if first dose was received at 16 years of age or older

These vaccinations can be obtained at any Public Health clinic (315-386-2325) or from your private health care provider.



New York State law requires that all new entrants (whether PreK or Kdg), Grades 1, 3, 5, 7, 9 and 11, and all students entering a school district for the first time have a health examination by a New York State licensed provider. This exam must be provided to school within 30 days of entry into school or the grade levels indicated. A review of the immunization certificates and/or other proof of immunity are needed at the time of registration of all students, inclusive of new entrants and transfers.

Medication: If your child will be taking medicine at school, provider and parent permission forms are needed for both prescription and over-the-counter medications. **New medication permission forms are required each year and the form is available online under the "Medications" tab of the School Nurse webpage.**

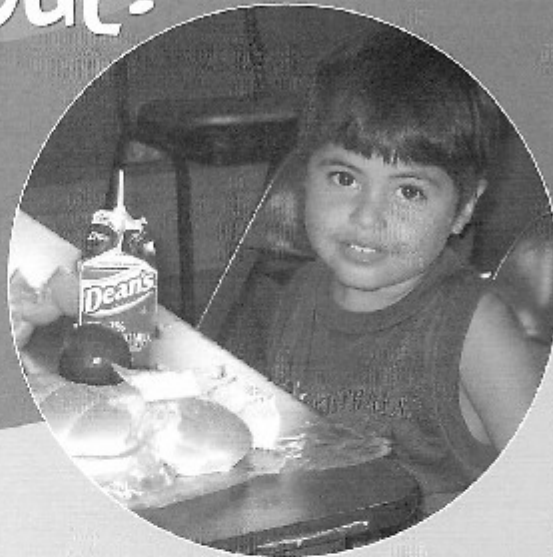
